I- Course

Phrasal verb = Verb + particle

- 1- Literal: The meaning = the meaning of the verb + the meaning of the particle.
 - Examples: go out ,come in,run away, sit down...etc
- 2- Non literal: The meaning = Totally different.
 - Examples : give up:stop
- 3- Some phrasal verbs are separable, others are non-separable.
 - Examples: put on your jacket = put your jacket on
 - give up smoking (NOT give smoking up)
