Grammar Note

To make comparatives with short adjectives, add *er + than* (tall: *taller than*).

To make comparatives with long adjective, add *more + adjective + than* (expensive: *more expensive than*).

When the adjective ends in *y*, change the *y* to *ier* (dirty: *dirtier*).

When the adjective ends in a vowel and a consonant, double the consonant (hot: *hotter*).

as + adjective + as is used to compare two people or things which are similar.

not as + adjective + as is used in negative sentences.

To make superlatives with short adjectives, add *est* and don't forget *the* before the adjective (small: *the smallest*).

To make superlatives with long adjectives, add *the most + adjective* (expensive: *the most expensive*).

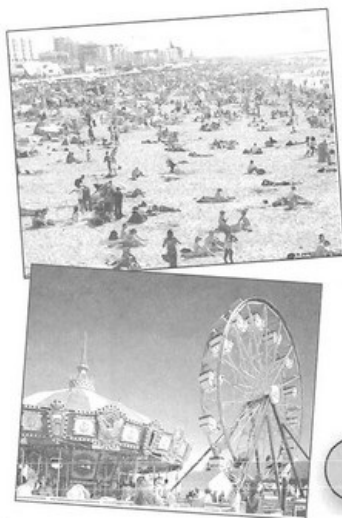
