Grammar Note

To make comparatives with short adjectives, add er + than (tall: taller than).

To make comparatives with long adjective, add *more* + *adjective* + *than* (expensive: *more expensive than*).

When the adjective ends in *y*, change the *y* to *ier* (dirty: *dirtier*).

When the adjective ends in a vowel and a consonant, double the consonant (hot: hotter)

as + adjective + as is used to compare two people or things which are similar.

not as + adjective + as is used in negative sentences.

To make superlatives with short adjectives, add est and don't forget the before the adjective (small; the smallest)

To make superlatives with long adjectives, add the most + adjective (expensive: the most expensive).


